Alison Ralston, from Norbreck, says she was so desperate to have a baby with husband Adam that, after three IVF cycles and a late miscarriage, she turned to Russell Hoyles at the new Spire Fylde Coast Hospital Lytham Clinic. Alison should see Russell.
Alison added: "Russell put
me at ease instantly. He
understood how I was feeling
and suggested that initially we
did some work simply around
relaxing and sleeping better.
"This worked wonderfully
well, and when we started
work specifically related to
fertility and conception, I was
already feeling better and less

anxious about the situation. Russell said if I could relax and expect to get pregnant I would significantly enhance the chances of doing so." After another round of IVF in June, Alison became pregnant. Having met with Russell on 10 occasions, she credits him with helping her overcome her anxiety. She added: "Russell's sessions,

and just knowing he would always get back to me if I contacted him, helped me tremendously.
"He was able to 'flick the switch' to expecting a good outcome, and his confidence that this would happen was born out on February 11 when baby Thomas arrived.
